Fondation Golf Canada

The Golf Canada Foundation was organized in 1979 through the initiative of the Royal Canadian Golf Association.

The mandate of the Foundation, a registered Canadian amateur athletic association, is to raise and grant funds for the advancement of golf in Canada. The Foundation delivers this mandate by awarding scholarships to Canadian student golfers and distributing grants to support initiatives in women's golf, junior golf, high performance golf, collegiate golf, and golf heritage. Money is raised for qualifying programs through fundraising events, the Golf Canada Foundation Trustee program, and other donation campaigns and initiatives

Mission

The Golf Canada Foundation's mission is to provide golfers and industry partners with a charitable platform to increase participation in golf by engaging players of all ages and abilities across Canada.

Vision

To become the leading voice of golf philanthropy in Canada.

Donations & Grants

As a non-profit organization, the Foundation relies on donations as an essential source of revenue. Tax receipts are issued for all donations.

La Fondation Golf Canada a vu le jour en 1979 à l'initiative de l'Association Royale de Golf du Canada.

Le mandat de la Fondation, une association canadienne enregistrée de sport amateur, est de collecter et octroyer des fonds pour l'avancement du golf canadien. Conformément à sa mission, la Fondation attribue des bourses à des étudiants-golfers canadiens et finance diverses initiatives comme le golf féminin, le golf junior, le golf de haute performance, le golf universitaire et le patrimoine golfique. Les sommes sont recueillies à la faveur d'événements de collecte de fonds, du programme Supporteurs de la Fondation Golf Canada et d'autres campagnes et initiatives de collecte de fonds.

Rapport du président de la Fondation Golf Canada

In 2015 the Golf Canada Foundation followed up a very successful 2014 with increases in funding for high performance, junior programs, and women's golf.

We're extremely proud to provide support for the Young Pro Squad as a part of Team Canada, which was launched in 2014 as one of Golf Canada's major initiatives with funding from the Foundation. This is an important program that provides a bridge between the outstanding successes Canada has had at the amateur level to helping more young professional players make the leap to a career at the top levels of the game.

Modeled after successful international programs, Young Pro provides coaching, training camps, financial assistance, and the latest in sports science support to allow the players to focus on becoming the best players possible. We strongly believe that Canadians performing well on the world stage will inspire the next generation of players to help grow the game in Canada.

Foundation Donors and Events

Our Trustee program grew significantly to a total of 38 Trustees investing in the Foundation and the programs we support. Starting at a minimum investment of \$5,000 per year, Trustees receive the opportunity to access to the best in Canadian golf: events, experiences, players, and partner discounts and offers.

In 2015 the Foundation focused on five main fundraising events:

1. The Monday Pro-Am at the RBC Canadian Open, Glen Abbey Golf Club
2. Play Like the Pros, Glen Abbey Golf Club
3. The Canadian Pacific Women's Open Monday Pro-Am, The Vancouver Golf Club
4. Wine, Women, and Shoes, Angus Glen Golf Club
5. Golf Canada Foundation Invitational, Cabot Links and Cabot Cliffs

En 2015, la Fondation Golf Canada a continué sur sa lancée fructueuse de 2014 et a accru ses subventions à la haute performance, aux programmes pour juniors et au golf féminin.

Nous sommes extrêmement fiers de soutenir financièrement l'une des initiatives les plus importantes de Golf Canada, le programme Jeune pro, lancé en 2014, qui fait partie d'Équipe Canada. Voilà une initiative importante qui jette un pont entre les niveaux amateur et professionnel pour aider nos amateurs d'élite à avoir autant de succès dans les rangs professionnels.

S'inspirant de programmes internationaux fructueux, Jeune pro, par le truchement de l'entraînement, de camps, d'aide financière et de la science du sport, permettra aux membres de cette formation d'atteindre leur plein potentiel. Nous sommes convaincus qu'en obtenant des résultats probants sur la scène mondiale, ces Canadiens inspireront la génération suivante et contribueront à l'essor du golf au Canada.

Donateurs et événements de la Fondation

Le programme Supporteurs continue de croître et à ce jour, 38 supporteurs ont investi dans la Fondation et dans les programmes qu'elle soutient. Grâce à un investissement minimum de 5 000 \$, les supporteurs obtiennent un accès exclusif à des tournois et événements golfs, aux joueurs les plus en vue et à des offres spéciales de nos partenaires.

Scholarships/Grants

The Golf Canada Foundation continued its long-standing support of collegiate golf in Canada by awarding fifteen scholarships with a combined value of \$53,500, and 31 matching grants totaling \$75,000, which ensured \$150,000 went toward Canadian college and university golf programs. I would like to thank the Scholarship/Grant committee and the Women's Fund committee for their hard work and oversight of two important Foundation programs.

I also wish to thank the Canadian Seniors' Golf Association for their continued funding of the scholarships and significant emphasis on giving back to junior golf, over \$100,000 in the past three years! Furthermore, I extend our thanks to Ron Sills and the many friends of Mike Hay who created a Mike's Kids Fund in Mike's name to engage Edmonton area children in golf after Mike passed away in 2015.

CEO REPORT

Rapport du chef de la direction

2015 was a year of significant growth in donors and consolidation around our most successful events, allowing the Foundation to increase our support to national team golfers, collegiate golfers, provincial golf associations, Canadian colleges and universities, and juniors. Highlights include:

- Team Canada's Young Pro Squad combined for 13 wins in 2015, including Brooke Henderson's win on the LPGA Tour, and three members qualifying for the Web.com Tour.
- Launch of the Play Like The Pros Charity Challenge, a series of mini-tournaments at some of the best golf courses in Ontario where golfers pledge support for junior golf through the Golf Canada Foundation (culminating in a final event at Glen Abbey Golf Club, host of the RBC Canadian Open, the day after the tournament's conclusion)
- Taking the Golf Canada Foundation Invitational outside of Ontario to Cabot Links and Cabot Cliffs in Nova Scotia, one of the top golf destinations in the country.
- Expanded our matching grant program to 31 schools across Canada.

Financial Performance

We're thrilled to report that we donated almost \$1 million in 2015 due to major growth in our Trustee program, and making our events best in class. We received growth in support in Western Canada from the Vancouver and Calgary markets, along with Eastern Canada from Montreal and the east coast.

En 2015, nous avons consolidé nos événements les plus réussis qui ont vu croître le nombre de leurs donateurs, ce qui a permis à la Fondation d'augmenter son soutien aux membres des équipes nationales, aux golfeurs universitaires, aux associations provinciales de golf, aux universités et collèges canadiens et aux juniors. Voici les points saillants :

- La formation Jeune pro d'Équipe Canada a récolté 13 victoires en 2015, dont celle de Brooke Henderson sur le Circuit de la LPGA; trois de ses membres se sont qualifiés pour le Circuit Web.com.
- Le Défi de bienfaisance Jouer comme un pro, une série de mini-tournois dans quelques-uns des clubs les plus réputés de l'Ontario, a été lancé. Les golfeurs participants soutiennent le golf junior par le truchement de la Fondation Golf Canada. La série culmine au Glen Abbey Golf Club, hôte de l'Omnium canadien RBC, le lendemain du tournoi.
- Le Tournoi sur invitation de la Fondation Golf Canada a été disputé hors de l'Ontario, aux parcours Cabot Links et Cabot Cliffs de la Nouvelle-Écosse, l'une des destinations golf les plus recherchées au pays.
- Notre programme de subventions de contrepartie touche maintenant 31 établissements scolaires au Canada.

Rendement financier

Nous sommes heureux d'annoncer que nous avons versé des dons de près de 1 M \$ en 2015 grâce à la croissance considérable du programme Supporteurs. Dans l'ouest canadien, la croissance a le plus été marquée dans les marchés de Vancouver et Calgary; elle s'est aussi manifestée dans la région de Montréal et sur la côte atlantique.

Objectives for 2016

2016 is a big year as golf returns to the Olympics, with several former Team Canada players on track to represent Canada on the world stage. One of the Foundation's main goals is to help the best players inspire the next generation of Canadian golfers, through the Olympic Games and results on the PGA Tour and LPGA Tour.

Canada is the top golfing nation in the world per capita, and more Canadians play golf than any other sport. As we reach out to the golf community across the country, we hope to engage more people who love golf and want to give back to the game. In 2016 we are striving to:

- Expand Play Like the Pros to more provinces;
- Reach more golfers through our women's fundraiser; and
- Engage more fans at both the RBC Canadian Open and the Canadian Pacific Women's Open.

Thank you to Canadian Pacific, RBC, Citi Canada, TaylorMade, Titleist, our Trustees, and the significant contribution of the volunteer Foundation Board. All have been instrumental on building the Foundation into one of the top sports charities in Canada.

Objectifs pour 2016

L'année 2016 sera particulièrement importante puisqu'elle marquera le retour du golf aux Jeux olympiques. Plusieurs anciens membres d'Équipe Canada représenteront le Canada sur la scène internationale. L'un des objectifs prioritaires de la Fondation est de faire de l'élite du golf l'inspiration de la prochaine génération de golfeurs canadiens à la faveur de leurs résultats aux Jeux olympiques, sur le PGA TOUR et sur le Circuit de la LPGA.

Le Canada est la première nation au monde pour la pratique du golf per capita et les Canadiens sont plus nombreux à s'adonner au golf qu'à tout autre sport. En 2016, nous souhaitons :

- mobiliser plus de spectateurs à l'occasion de l'Omnium canadien RBC et de l'Omnium féminin Canadien Pacifique.

WOMEN'S FUND REPORT

Rapport du Fonds destiné aux femmes

The Women's Fund had a very rewarding year under the umbrella of the Golf Canada Foundation. A total of \$188,280 was granted from the fund in 2015 for 6 very worthwhile projects.

1. Golf Canada World Junior Girls Championship – \$75,000

2015 saw the second year of the World Junior Girls Championship. This year's tournament was held at The Marshes Golf Club in Ottawa, and included 45 of the best young female golfers from 14 countries. It also delivered grass roots participation for young girls through free golf clinics. The Women's Fund grant of \$75,000 helped to make this event a huge success.

2. Golf Newfoundland Labrador – \$3,780

Golf Newfoundland Labrador delivered 10 Lunch & Learn golf sessions to 86 participants at three different courses. The sessions each included brief instruction on the driving range, a seminar on the rules & etiquette of golf, and a small reception.

3. Golf Quebec – \$2,000

Golf Quebec visited junior girls Ringette teams to promote golf with the "She Swings, She Scores" program. This program gave young girls the opportunity to use golf equipment in their own environment as well as a team visit to a local golf facility.

4. Canadian Women's Tour – \$50,000

In its thirteenth season, the Canadian Women's Tour held three tournaments across the country. Each event saw a field of elite amateurs and emerging professionals competing for exemptions into the Canadian Pacific Women's Open. The funding from the Golf Canada Foundation Women's Fund supported the management and execution of these events, offering a unique circuit in Canada for budding professionals and amateurs to compete and improve.

Le Fonds destiné aux femmes a connu une année très gratifiante sous l'égide de la Fondation Golf Canada. En 2015, le Fonds a accordé des subventions totalisant 188 280 \$ à six projets des plus méritoires.

1. Championnat mondial junior féminin de Golf Canada – 75 000 \$

La deuxième édition du Championnat mondial junior féminin a été présentée en 2015 au The Marshes Golf Club d'Ottawa. Quarante-cinq des meilleures golfeuses juniors de 14 pays ont pris part à ce prestigieux tournoi pour filles juniors. Le championnat a aussi proposé des leçons de golf gratuites pour jeunes filles. La subvention de 75 000 \$ du Fonds destiné aux femmes a contribué au succès de cet événement.

2. Golf Newfoundland Labrador – 3 780 \$

Golf Newfoundland Labrador a organisé 10 sessions de golf Lunch & Learn auxquels ont participé 86 personnes sur trois parcours. Les sessions comprenaient un cours sur le terrain d'exercice, un séminaire sur les règles et l'étiquette et une réception.

3. Golf Québec – 2 000 \$

Golf Québec a visité des équipes de ringuette composées de filles juniors pour faire la promotion du golf par le truchement du programme « Elle s'élance et compte ». Ce programme permet aux jeunes filles d'utiliser de l'équipement de golf dans un environnement familial et de visiter un établissement de golf local.

4. Circuit canadien féminin – 50 000 \$

À sa 13^e saison, le Circuit canadien féminin a présenté trois tournois dans diverses régions du pays. Des amateurs d'élite et de jeunes professionnelles prometteuses ont participé à ces tournois dans l'espoir d'obtenir un laissez-passer pour l'Omnium féminin Canadien Pacifique. Des subventions du Fonds destiné aux femmes de la Fondation Golf Canada ont été affectées à l'administration et à la présentation

5. British Columbia Golf – \$7,500

The Golf Canada Foundation Women's Fund supported an on-course "Women, Business & Golf" multi-faceted golf series. In total three (3) focus groups were held and eight (8) clinics/workshops were organized with 85 female participants. The program was successful on many fronts, including the development of branding, design of program content, networking, social media, securing support of women coaches' and the creation of a sponsorship package.

6. Young Pro Program – \$50,000

The Women's Fund approved \$50,000 to go directly towards matching donations to support a team of young professionals. The primary focus is to help improve the playing ability of players once they turn pro by overcoming the many hurdles they face in coaching, managing their careers, equipment, sport science schedule and training. This year recipients were: Rebecca Lee Bentham, Brooke Henderson and Sue Kim.

As Chair for 2015, I would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to our committee for their dedication and commitment in upholding the integrity and mandate of this fund. Also thank you to Martin, Spencer and the Foundation Board for their support of the Women's Fund. I would also like to extend a special thank you to previous chair Pat Thompson for her many years of service and dedication, and her guidance in my transition to the role.

5. British Columbia Golf – 7 500 \$

Le Fonds destiné aux femmes de la Fondation Golf Canada a appuyé une série de golf à facettes multiples intitulée Women, Business and Golf. Trois sessions ont eu lieu et huit cours pratiques/ateliers ont été organisées auxquels ont participé 85 femmes. Le programme a été couronné de succès à maints égards : développement de la marque, conception du contenu des programmes, réseautage, médias sociaux, soutien des entraîneuses et création d'un forfait commandite.

6. Programme Jeune pro – 50 000 \$

Le Fonds destiné aux femmes a approuvé l'octroi de 50 000 \$ pour égaler les dons de soutien à une équipe de jeunes professionnelles. L'objectif premier est d'aider les jeunes pros à surmonter les nombreux obstacles qui se dressent devant eux durant la phase de transition du point de vue de l'entraînement, de la gestion de carrière, de l'équipement et de la science du sport. Rebecca Lee-Bentham, Brooke Henderson et Sue Kim ont été les lauréates en 2015.

SCHOLARSHIP & GRANTS COMMITTEE REPORT

Rapport du Comité des bourses et subventions

The committee, along with Martin and Spencer, once again evaluated scholarship applications from all across Canada. In 2015 the Foundation received 60 applications, an increase from 2014 numbers. 15 students were awarded scholarships and the combined value of these awards was \$53,500. It is important to continue to implement a concerted effort to increase awareness across Canada of the scholarships available.

The University Grant Fund

2015 was the second year of the new format for collegiate grants. Funding provided by the Foundation is reserved for matching external funds raised by university and college golf programs. Schools must apply for the funding, and once they are approved they must demonstrate the amount that they have raised externally over a specific time period. In 2015, 32 academic institutions submitted applications requesting grant funding, an increase from 25 applications in 2014. All but one school received funding, and a total of \$75,000 in grants was distributed to 31 golf programs generating over \$150,000 to support collegiate golf in Canada.

The goal of the grant program for Canadian Universities and Colleges continues to be to provide a viable option for young Canadian golfers to pursue their post-secondary educations in Canada. The program reached approximately 470 students this year, providing scholarships for academics and funds for golf programs at the schools, so that students can continue to play golf while studying and developing as future members of the Canadian business community.

Le Comité, de concert avec Martin et Spencer, a une fois de plus examiné les demandes de bourse provenant de toutes les régions du Canada. En 2015, la Fondation a reçu 60 demandes, une augmentation comparativement à 2014. La Fondation a octroyé des bourses totalisant 53 500 \$ à 15 étudiants. Encore une fois, il est extrêmement important de concerter nos efforts pour tenir le public canadien au courant des bourses disponibles.

Fonds de soutien universitaire

2015 a marqué la deuxième année du nouveau processus d'octroi des subventions postsecondaires. Les subventions accordées par la Fondation égalent les fonds collectés par les universités et collèges ayant un programme de golf. Les établissements doivent faire une demande de subvention. Une fois leur demande approuvée, elles doivent révéler le montant qu'elles ont recueilli à l'externe sur une période définie. En 2015, 32 établissements d'enseignement ont soumis une demande de subvention, soit 7 de plus qu'en 2014. À l'exception d'une école, tous les postulants ont reçu une subvention. Celles-ci ont totalisé 75 000 \$, si bien que les 31 programmes de golf universitaires et collégiaux ont pu compter sur plus de 150 000 \$.

L'objectif du programme de soutien aux universités et collèges canadiens est de permettre aux jeunes golfeuses et golfeurs canadiens de poursuivre leurs études postsecondaires au Canada. Le programme, qui a touché 470 étudiants en 2015, fournit des bourses pour des programmes scolaires et golifiques aux établissements postsecondaires. 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Independent Auditor's Report

1. Nature of Operations

The Golf Canada Foundation (formerly RCGA Foundation) is a Registered Canadian Amateur Athletic Association and is exempt from income tax in Canada under the Income Tax Act (Canada).

Each member of the Board of Directors of the Royal Canadian Golf Association (operating as Golf Canada) is a member of the Foundation. As a result, the Foundation is effectively controlled by Golf Canada. Golf Canada is the National Sport Organization and governing body of golf in Canada.

The Foundation's mission is to provide golfers and industry partners with a charitable platform to increase participation in golf by engaging players of all ages and abilities across Canada. While collegiate golf has historically been the main focus of the Foundation, the organization's recently expanded activities have broadened the Foundation's focus to include several other programs to benefit golf in Canada. During the year, the Foundation paid a total of \$965,244 (2014 - \$918,772) in grants and scholarships to advance the sport of golf in Canada. The Foundation's impact on various aspects of the sport of golf is summarized below:

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of presentation

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. Accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations (ASNPO) require entities to select policies appropriate for their circumstances from choices provided in the specific standards in Part III of the CPA Canada Handbook.

(b) Fund accounting

The accounts of the Foundation are maintained in accordance with the principles of fund accounting. Under fund accounting, resources are allocated to funds according to their nature and purpose. The Foundation uses the following funds:

Operating Fund

The Operating Fund includes revenue and expenses related to scholarships, grants and administrative activities, including restricted contributions available for use, but expendable only for purposes specified by the donor or grantor, that are not included in any other fund.

Endowment Fund

The Endowment Fund includes income and disbursements made in the form of scholarship funds that have been designated by the donors – the Connor/Spafford Scholarship and the Marlene Stewart Streit Golf Scholarship.

Investment income earned on the endowment funds are allocated to the specific fund, net of administration fees.

(c) Use of estimates

The preparation of these financial statements in conformity with ASNPO requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(d) Financial instruments

The Foundation initially measures its financial assets and liabilities at fair value. Subsequently, the Foundation measures all its financial instruments at fair value or amortized cost with subsequent changes in fair value recognized in the statement of revenues and expenses.

Fair values are based on quoted market prices where available from active markets, otherwise fair values are estimated using a variety of valuation techniques and models. Financial assets and liabilities measured at amortized cost include cash, receivables, payables and accruals, amounts payable to Golf Canada and deferred scholarship contributions. The Foundation measures investments at fair value.

(e) Revenue recognition

Contributions are recorded in the appropriate fund in the year received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured. Funds contributed for specific purposes that are part of the Operating Fund are recorded as deferred scholarship contributions on the statement of financial position until expended on scholarships or grants in future periods. Contributions are then recorded as revenue and an expense when the related scholarship or grant is paid. Investment income is recognized when earned. Donated materials or services by way of gifts-in-kind are recognized as revenue when the fair value can be reasonably estimated.

The Foundation may record administration fees on certain endowment and designated deferred scholarship contributions based on the nature of the deferred funds and agreement set forth with the donor. Administration fees are recorded as revenue in the operating fund as a general donation.

(f) Expense recognition

Expenses are recorded when incurred. Scholarships and grants are recorded upon approval.

3. Financial Instruments

Credit risk

The Foundation is subject to credit risk through receivables. Credit risk is minimized by dealing primarily with organizations and donors with strong financial positions.

Market risk

The Foundation is exposed to market fluctuations through its investments quoted in active markets. Market risk is the risk that the fair value of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in those market prices, whether those changes are caused by factors specific to the individual financial instrument or its issuer, or factors affecting all similar financial instruments traded in the markets.

4. Investments

The Foundation's investment portfolio consists of a mix of active and passive investments consisting of pooled global and North American income and equity funds as well as shares of mortgage investment corporations. The portfolio is governed by an Investment Committee and management obtain input on a regular basis from the Association's professional advisors in making decisions relating to the portfolio. Investment income recognized in the Statement of Revenues and Expenses include the following:

From time to time the Board may approve the transfer of funds from General Operations to one of the specific programs.

8. Related party transactions

The Payable to Golf Canada is settled on a periodic basis. Transactions between the two entities consist of reimbursements to Golf Canada for expenses paid on behalf of the Foundation and for grants paid to support the World Jr. Girls Championship, Canadian Women's Tour, Team Canada and Young Pro Programs. Total grants paid to Golf Canada during the year were \$709,000 (2014 - \$565,400) and have been reflected in Grants on the Statement of Revenues and Expenses.
